

Support is growing for assisted dying, says Tory

Assisted dying could be legalised in the UK within four years, according to a leading Tory MP.

Andrew Mitchell, who recently took up the role of co-chairman of the all-party parliamentary group for choice at the end of life, has said that there is growing support for a change in the law that would give choice to people who are nearing the end of their lives. Previously, parliament has always voted against allowing any form of assisted dying.

"I was, as a student and as a young MP, adamantly opposed to assisted dying and over the years my view has changed completely," Mr Mitchell told Sky News.
